New Governor-General and Mia Mia's "Young Jim"

On 7th April 2014 Jim Coombe met the new Governor General, the newly knighted Sir Peter Cosgrove. Jim was one of two Jims doing volunteer work with BlazeAid based at Wandong.

One Jim was very tall, so he became "Big Jim" and our Jim, the oldest of the volunteers at 83, became "Young Jim." Meeting the new Governor General was "a great experience," said Jim, "I was introduced to him as the oldest BlazeAid volunteer, he asked how old I was and then told me I didn't look as old as that." As BlazeAid's oldest volunteer Young Jim has become well known across the state.

Young Jim intended to do two weeks of volunteering work with BlazeAid starting early March, but he ended up doing fencing and educating new fencing enthusiasts in the art over a period of five weeks. In one of the teams he worked with he was the oldest and the youngest was an eighteen-year old woman.

"The best thing about the experience," Jim said, "was seeing the expression of hope and gratitude on the faces of those farmers we were helping out. Many are reluctant to ask for help, there have been sad outcomes for some farming families when things look hopeless. When a BlazeAid team turns up and they realise that there are people who can help them get their fences rebuilt, the mix of gratitude and relief for the assistance they receive is a great reward. One farmer told us that our team of four did in a couple of days what he would have taken three weeks to do by himself.

"I have benefited both physically and mentally from my experience with BlazeAid, I recommend it to anyone who can help - for a day, or a week, whatever you can do. Information about BlazeAid can be found at blazeaid.com.au, or call 0400 833 262." Jim Coombe
