Ms Groves' Classroom report

In Maths, seniors have been working with the jump and compensation (short cut) strategies to help them strengthen their use of mental arithmetic strategies. This week, they have consolidated their understanding of all three strategies (including the split strategy) and have been able to demonstrate their new knowledge by mentally adding 2-digit and 3-digit numbers without the use of concrete materials or pencils. Students have made flip books, used think boards and practiced these strategies every day. It would be great if you could help them consolidate this knowledge at home by asking them to add 2-digit numbers in their head - for example, by using the split strategy of adding the 10s first, and then the 1s, then adding these totals together. Juniors have been looking at sharing objects as a start to their exploration into division.

In Literacy, the seniors have been continuing their character studies and learning about synonyms and antonyms to help build their vocabulary and strengthen their use of adjectives in their writing. Students have been practicing their use of capitals, ending punctuation, apostrophes and talking marks in Gotcha Grammar and doing fantastic work explaining why these grammar and punctuation features are needed in writing. Juniors have also been looking at book characters and focusing on writing on the line, forming letters properly and leaving spaces between words.
