

Principal's Report

Raffle

Thanks to all those families that took the time to sell the tickets for tonight's meat tray raffle. Thanks also to the Hotel for supporting our school. I'll look forward to catching up with those in attendance tonight.

3 Way Conference

We will be holding our 3 way conferences on Monday the 7th and Monday 14th of October, the first two Mondays of Term 4, between 2pm and 5.30pm. The main aim of this learning conversation is to discuss the future learning goals for your child in Literacy and Numeracy in Term 4. Attendance at this conference will help to ensure you are well positioned to assist your child's learning at home. A suitable time can be arranged by contacting the office. We will endeavour to arrange a time for all students prior to the end of term.

Footy Colours

The last Friday of Term will be footy colours Day. Students are encouraged to wear colours of their favourite team. Parents and families are encouraged to attend the afternoon. After recess, we aim to open the classrooms for children to present their learning, as well we will be having several football/sporting activities on the oval. Lunch will be party pies, served at 1pm. If possible, students are asked to bring \$2 on the day to cover the cost of lunch. Just a reminder that students will be dismissed at 2.30pm.

Student Free Day

In Term 4 we will be having our last 'Student Free Day'. Schools receive 4 student free days each year to allow for professional development, planning, administration, curriculum development, assessment and reporting. At RMMPS, we held 2 of these at the start of 2019 and another in June. Pending school council approval, the next date will be Tuesday October 22nd. This will be used to build our knowledge of Fountas and Pinnell and embedding it in our planning and assessment. This is a program used extensively in our Literacy learning.

Newsletter

As has occurred in previous terms, this will be our last newsletter for the term. Whilst maintaining open lines of communication with all families remains our number one priority, producing this weekly newsletter can be time consuming, particularly for our small staff. I'd welcome feedback on parents and families thoughts on their preference of weekly or fortnightly newsletters. I can then take this feedback to school council.

Child Safe Standards

The child safe standards require schools to consider all aspects of child safety and put measures in place to protect children from all forms of abuse, including:

- sexual or grooming offences
- physical violence
- serious emotional or psychological harm
- serious neglect.

There are seven child safe standards.

- 1. Strategies to embed an organisational culture of child safety.
- 2. A child safety policy or statement of commitment to child safety.
- 3. A child safety code of conduct.
- 4. School staff selection, supervision and management practices for a child-safe environment.
- 5. Procedures for responding to and reporting allegations of suspected child abuse.
- Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse.
- 7. Strategies to promote child empowerment and participation.
