Code Red Days

Redesdale Mia Mia PS has been identified as a high fire risk and is included on the Department's bushfire at-risk register. This means that on days determined Code Red by the Emergency Management Commissioner we will close

All families will be notified by text message. Once a Code Red day has been determined the decision will not change regardless of any changes in weather forecast. On Code Red Code Red days all bus routes servicing these schools will also be cancelled. Bus routes from schools not on the Department's bushfire at-risk register that enter high-risk areas will be pre-emptively closed as well e.g. Kyneton School Bus for older siblings.

Child Safe Standards

The child safe standards require schools to consider all aspects of child safety and put measures in place to protect children from all forms of abuse, including:



- sexual or grooming offences
- physical violence
- serious emotional or psychological harm
- serious neglect.

There are seven child safe standards:

- 1. *Strategies* to embed an organisational culture of child safety.
- A child safety policy or statement of commitment to child safety.
- 3. A child safety code of conduct.
- 4. School staff selection, supervision and management practices for a child-safe environment.
- 5. Procedures for responding to and reporting allegations of suspected child abuse.
- 6. Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse.
- 7. Strategies to promote child empowerment and participation.

Working with Children Checks (WWC)

Based on the new legislation and best practice that is in line with the Child Safe Standards, it is now a requirement for all parents and carers who volunteer their time at



Centrepay - An option to manage school costs

What is Centrepay?

Centrepay is a free direct bill-paying service offered to parents receiving Centrelink payments. Through Centrepay you can choose to pay bills by having a regular amount deducted from

your payments and transferred electronically to Redesdale Mia Mia Primary School.

Why use Centrepay?

Centrepay is voluntary. Parents who choose to use Centrepay benefit from its convenience and security knowing that their bills are under control. Instead of having large bills every month or quarter, your bills are paid in manageable amounts from your payments, making it easier for you to budget.

How do I set up Centrepay?

You can follow the steps below:

- Step 1: Sign in and access the main menu. Sign into MyGov and select your Centrelink online account to access the main menu and your homepage;
- **Step 2**: Add a new Centrepay deduction;
- **Step 3**: Choose a service provider;
- **Step 4**: Enter the details of your deduction;
- Step 5: Review and submit;
- Step 6: Sign out.
