Mum then went to Girton College, in Bendigo where she stayed during the school week with her grandmother (Gran) who she was very close with.

After High School Mum returned to 'Shepherds Creek' to work alongside her father and Uncle George and loved riding her horse 'Chester' doing the sheep work.

'She sailed with her father, scored for the cricket club, became a Wool Classer, raised her 3 children, bushwalked, travelled overseas, milked her goats, and loved her dogs and sheep.'



One of Mum's favorite interests at that time was sailing with her father when on the family holiday at Sorrento.

Another pastime was scoring for the Mia Mia Cricket Club and was where she met my father, Max Job.

Mum and Dad got married at the Mia Mia Church in January 1963 and settled at Birran Birran at North Redesdale which is just across the Campaspe from some of the family country. Mum and Dad had three children, Leonie, me (Roger) and Ivan. Sadly dad tragically died in 1971 which would have been very tough on Mum with three small children.

We moved to Redesdale where Mum built a house in Clarke street and she lived there for the next fifty years.

In the late 70's mum obtained her wool classer certificate and became a well-respected Wool Classer, classing the 'Shepherd Creek' wool for 10 years as well as other sheds in the district.

She remarried in September 1978 to Ted Hanbury and spent 37 happy years together rarely spending a day apart. They went on many trips both overseas and Australia and loved researching and visiting many historic sites and family histories.

Along with Aunty Maisie they also went on many trips bushwalking and site seeing even going to China in the 80's although Ted refused to leave Australia for that one.

Mum's love of pasture and animals along with her to trying to keep us healthy led her to get a pet goat which she milked when it had kids and then we had goats milk on 'everything' this went on for years with several different goats. We always had a dog and she loved her sheep.

Mum was always involved with various things like singing which started with Church as a girl and then singing groups Kyneton Heathcote and then at Domain Village in Bendigo, then there was her poetry of was very good at it quite a few were published in the 'Stock and Land' Newspaper.

Mum was also involved for a time with the 'Redesdale Revellers' a theatrical group which she enjoyed after Ted passed away, in 2015 mum moved to Bendigo Domain Village in 2020 where she had a busy lifestyle always doing something with various groups such as craft, singing, croquet with her many friends there.

Only 3 months ago mum moved into the Heathcote Hostel where she once again immersed herself into the lifestyle there and enjoyed going for walks and to Church. [R]




Mia Mia Cricket Club





RECIPE OF THE MONTH Scones

78





(Easy Peasy Way)
4 cups self-rising flour, sifted

600ml cream

Preheat oven to 220C

Position rack in middle of the oven

Use a large baking tray & cover with baking paper Sift the flour into a bowl, add the cream.

Using a flat blade knife mix gently till the dough comes together.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and gently knead for 30 seconds until just smooth.

Hints

Dip cutter into flour between cutting to stop sticking.

Replace 600ml of cream with 300ml of soda water and 300ml cream.

Great way to use frozen cream (defrost it first)

PS First cream then jam because the fat content from the cream coats your mouth Inhibiting the taste of jam!!!

Thank you to Claire McKenna from Aesop's Attic Kyneton for this never fail reciepe.

Press dough into roughly 2cm thick round, using a cutter, cut out the scones.

Bake for 15mins.


Companions for tomato - basil, asparagus, beans, beets, cabbage, chilli, capsicums, eggplant, marigolds, potatoes.

It is not too late to plant bare rooted ornamentals e.g. Crab apples, roses and lilacs.

Continue to plant a carpet of flowering natives e.g.; paper daisies, yellow buttons, and everlasting daisies.

Keep picking Sweet Pea flowers to promote continual blooms.


