As this will be my last article until March next year, I just wanted to revisit the steps that we can take to be safe over the summer period. Firstly, don't be that person who starts a fire. Sounds like common sense but unfortunately we keep turning up to fires at 3pm where the property owner is looking sheepish while standing next to a charred mower.

The first rule for preventing fires is " Don't mow dry grass " . An extension of this rule is avoid operating machinery in the heat of the day. Any engine will have a muffler that gets hot, can give off sparks , have bearings that overheat and/or have a metal blade that can cause a spark off a rock.

Knowing the forecast and using the weather conditions to your advantage can make a great difference to your safety if you have to operate machinery during the summer conditions. An example of the changeable weather conditions is from the Elders weather app from 12 months ago:

7am 12 degrees Celsius, 88% humidity and 5 kph winds

( can reasonably expect to control a fire outbreak)

2pm 34 degrees Celsius, 5% humidity and 30 kph winds

( would be difficult to get a fire under control)

My advice would be to work to the conditions and take advantage of favourable weather.

### THREATS AND EXTORTION SCAMS

### WOULD YOU RECONGISE THE SIGNS OF A THREAT AND EXTORTION SCAM?

Speak up and report before handing over money to someone who threatens you.

Scammers pretend to be from an organisation and claim you need to pay money. They may threaten you with arrest, deportation, or even physical harm, if you don't agree to pay them immediately.

They can also blackmail you by threatening to share naked pictures or videos you have sent them unless you send them money.

Don't be pressured by a threat. Stop and check whether it's true.

### WHAT ARE THE WARNING SIGNS IT MIGHT BE A SCAM?

You receive a call, message or email out of the blue from someone claiming to be from a government department, debt collection agency or trusted company.

They will claim that you owe money and threaten you with legal action or arrest.

The caller will tell you that to fix the matter you will need to pay a fee or fine.

The caller may ask for your personal information, such as your passport details, date of birth or bank information.

The caller may claim the police will come to your door and arrest you if you do not pay the fee or fine straight away.

You are asked to transfer money to an account to 'keep it safe' or for 'further investigation'.

### WHAT STEPS CAN YOU TAKE TO PROTECT YOURSELF?

Don't be pressured by a threatening caller asking for money. Hang up and don't respond.

Don't pay anyone by unusual methods such as by gift or store cards, iTunes vouchers, wire transfers or Bitcoins.

Don't use any contact details provided by the caller. Verify their identity by calling the relevant

organisation directly. Find them through an independent source such as a phone book, past bill or online search.

Do not respond to texts or emails. If you do, the scammers will escalate their intimidation and attempts to get your money.

#### **MORE SAFEGUARDS**

Never send money or give credit card details, online account details or identity information like your driver licence or passport to anyone you don't know or trust. Never share them by email or over the phone.

If you are concerned for your safety, contact the police.

If the scam is sent by email, don't open any attachments, click on links, or download files. They can infect your computer with malware.

#### THINK YOU'VE BEEN SCAMMED?

Act fast to stop any further losses

Contact your bank or card provider immediately to report the scam. Ask them to stop any transactions.

Change passwords on all your devices and online accounts like banking, email, government and shopping.

Get help to recover

IDCARE is Australia and New Zealand's national identity and cyber support service. They can help you make a plan (for free) to limit the damage. Call them on 1800 595 160 or visit their website to find out more.

Report the scam

Once you have secured your details, you can help try to stop the scam or to warn others by reporting the scam to SCAMWATCH.

Please be vigilant at all times, and particularly over the holiday period, with protecting your personal details and banking information.

# Remembering the characters of Redesdale & district: #1 Mrs Took

The old couple who lived on the next round over were Charlie and Leila Took. My memories of Mrs Took were ... just a bit different! She was a hard woman. Some say she would have died with the first cent (penny?) she ever earned! Mum was a good neighbour and friend to her.I remember many a time when Mrs Took's version of gratitude was to show up on our doorstep and drop off food – usually accompanied by the statement (or was it a warning?) that "it's out of date and just about to go off anyway". This food was quickly dispatched to the bin. Mrs Took would go to local events and be seen gathering up the leftover food: claiming it was for the dogs. But we all knew that Charlie would eat well that night. And the dogs...well, I doubt they got any of the bounty!

Back in those days, the big deal was the local dance. The entry was often 50 cents or ladies brought a plate. Mrs Took would nearly always bring along a sponge - no icing, no filling. Just a sponge cake! Not surprisingly, the Hall ladies would be too embarrassed to serve it up, so Mrs Took was able to take her sponge home. The locals caught onto this scam pretty quickly. One night someone (who shall remain nameless!) who was a bit of a wag, grabbed the sponge; put it on their seat; sat on it and then started yelling out, "Oh no, I've at on Mrs Took's sponge. There'll be cream and icing everywhere. What a mess". If look could have killed – they'd have been an autopsy at Kyneton that week!

I remember another time when Mrs Took came around to see Mum. My brother Ross and I decided to get well out of the way and decided to go for a ride up the paddock: he on a minibike and me relegated to a pushie. I couldn't keep up (no surprise!) so we hatched what we thought was a cunning

plan – him towing me along behind him, on a rope. All good, until...we headed home. Ross went first around the corner only to find Mrs Took coming along the driveway. He stopped straight away. I, on the other hand, did not. I kept coming until the rope went taut and I was thrown headfirst over the handlebars. I landed on the road and Mrs Took blissfully drove straight over the top of me. And kept on going! Yep! Luckily all I ended up with was a bit of gravel rash to show for the ordeal (no...no tyre marks!). Mum knew she was a terrible driver and had always been concerned when she left that she would take out a section of the picket fence around the garden or the washing line. Don't think she ever imagined Mrs Took would take out her son!

  - Strong Multi-Factor-Authentication (Notifying you if there is an attempt to open the gate & like having a more difficult lock)
  - Can you keep your security updated (Like performing regular maintenance on the gate)

## CFA brigades in need of investment ahead of fire season

Nationals Member for Euroa Annabelle Cleeland has called on the Labor Government to ensure local CFA brigades are properly equipped to handle what is expected to be an intense fire season.

After documents from Fire Rescue Victoria were made public recently, reports indicated that more than half of Melbourne's fire truck fleet is over 15 years old, while the situation is even more dire for our regional brigades.

"So many of our dedicated volunteer fire brigades are stuck with the majority of their vehicles, pumpers, and tankers being over 20 years old," Ms Cleeland said.

"Many other CFA appliances throughout the region are listed as being over 30 years old.

"Having met with many brigade captains and volunteers recently, there are serious concerns about these ageing vehicles, as well as the culture of the CFA, as it deals with a lack of funding and support from the Labor Government."

A report made by the Grattan Institute last year highlighted the dangers associated with trucks this old, including carcinogens that can cause serious illness and death, increased carbon emissions, pollution and more.

Speaking in Parliament recently, Ms Cleeland said failing to provide our brigades with fit-for- purpose vehicles, together with several other recent policy decisions, would be putting our communities, and volunteer firefighters, at risk.

"With the fire season approaching, our CFA brigades are in desperate need of appliances that are fit for purpose in order to protect our volunteer firefighters and to protect our communities," Ms Cleeland said.

"As we approach summer, we have seen a string of bad decisions by this Government when it comes to fire management. This includes a lack of planned burns, the closing of the sustainable native timber industry, and a reduction in 6,500 operational CFA volunteers since 2015.

"History has shown the only time this Government shows an interest in resourcing rural brigades is after tragic fire events.

"We simply cannot afford to leave it too late this time." Ms Cleeland has invited any local brigades to meet with her ahead of the high fire danger period, with the local member eager to ensure that the dedicated volunteers who put theirlives on the line for our community have their voices heard.

### RECIPE OF THE MONTH Banana Cake

80



This is the easiest cake you will ever make. Very old bananas or frozen ones can be used Simply place uneaten fruit in freezer and take out and defrost when ready to bake cake.

2 ½ cups self-rising flour 1 teaspoon bicarb soda 1 cup castor sugar 4 eggs lightly beaten 2 ½ cups mashed banana (5 large very ripe bananas)

- 200grams chopped walnuts (optional)
- 1 cup oil any sort (I always use olive oil) Beat together all ingredients.
- Bake in a slow oven (160) for approx.
- 1 ½ hours. Cake is cooked when firm to touch.

#### Icing

- 100g cream cheese
- 60g butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 tablespoon apricot jam
- 2 cups sifted icing sugar
- Beat all together and ice the cake when it is cold.

Alternative icing is a simple icing sugar with lemon juice as per picture

Continue to check mulch levels on beds and pots and top up where thinning, as it will be rotting down

Mulch helps to keep the soil moist and cool.

Weed and water regularly, particularly plants in containers and grow bags.

Tie peas to frames.

Net brassicas and cabbages to protect them from white cabbage moths.

Place pheromone traps for coddling moth in apple

Stone fruit, especially peach and pear trees will need "Blood and Bone", manure or similar organic fertiliser, spread over their roots.

Don't forget to water before and after.

Mulch and deeply water your raspberries now as the fruit is forming.

Feed asparagus with a general purpose fertiliser once you have finished harvesting spears. Don't cut them down until autumn.

Encourage pollinators into you kitchen garden with plants such as cosmos, alyssum & cleome, borage

Keep planting your summer flowering perennials
