

This could have been simpler and less messy if I had just gone to the fire station and picked up a trigger operated gas leak detector. These are free of charge and available to all community members. Contact me or call around on a Sunday mornings to receive this or any of our fire prevention information packs. We also have plenty of little red fire fighters helmets for the kids.

The recent Labour Day long weekend was a real success for the brigade with many worthwhile contacts made from a wide range of community members. The outdoor cinema was well attended and the market was a great way to meet people, especially the younger generation through having a ride in the little red truck or operating the hose line with our Captain Mitchell. We are always looking for members and you don't have to be a "Firefighter " to be a Fire-fighter. There are many jobs within the brigade that don't involve going out on the truck. We do community engagement, fund-raising, catering and are there to support local events. 

#### Telecommunications must be considered critical infrastructure

Nationals Member for Euroa Annabelle Cleeland has stressed the need for telecommunications to be considered as critical infrastructure, meeting with the Minister for Government Services to advocate to Federal Government.

After power outages left residents throughout the Euroa electorate without access to phone service, Ms Cleeland said it was integral that telecommunications were regulated and strengthened under federal laws like the Security of Critical Infrastructure Act (SoCI).

"Strengthening our telecommunications infrastructure is an essential step to ensuring residents are not left without access to their phones during emergencies such as power outages, floods, and fires," Ms Cleeland said.

"With so many emergency response measures, such as CFA or SES notifications and evacuation messages, now being carried out through text messages, it is critical that telecommunications infrastructure can withstand actual emergencies.

"I have met with the Minister to discuss the importance of this and have been assured that this will be followed up with Federal Ministers tasked with this responsibility.

" Battery and energy backups, cybersecurity, and reliable service are just some of the areas that could be strengthened by including telecommunications in the SoCl, where it would join other essential services such as banking and finance, government, communications, energy, food and grocery, health, transport, and water.

"Mobile phone reception is undeniably critical infrastructure in today's world, serving as the primary connector between individuals and emergency services," Ms Cleeland said.

"During crises such as natural disasters or accidents, reliable mobile reception is essential for emergency response coordination, dissemination of vital information, and enabling individuals to call for help or assistance.

"We cannot stand by and hear of another emergency where someone was unable to call for help or receive warnings about nearby bushfires."

# CONNECTIVITY



Annabelle Cleeland, our State member for Euroa has voiced her support for our attempts to win recognition for our problems in this area. ### RECIPE OF THE MONTH 82

**Grilled Vegetable Platter** 



2 eggplants sliced into ½ cm rings
4 zucchini sliced lengthways
1 bunch asparagus
2 red onions cut into 8 sections
2 red capsicums
1 bunch rocket
1 cup olive oil
2 cloves garlic finely chopped
3 table spoons balsamic vinegar
Salt and pepper to taste

In a large bowl place the sliced eggplants and zucchini, add garlic, olive oil, salt and pepper, Toss well. Heat up the grill section of the b-b-q, making sure it is hot.

Place the capsicums on the grill and cook till the skin blackens. Remove and place in a bowl.

Place the vegies on the grill and cook till the black lines are very marked. It will be hot and smokey. Remove and place in a separate bowl. Now do the same with the asparagus and onions.

Clean the skins and seeds from the capsicums, do not rinse as this takes away most of the flavour. Cut into strips.

On a large platter arrange the rocket and all the vegetables.

Drizzle with the balsamic vinegar. Best served at room temperature.

Spring Onions - PS thickly in wide drills

Dribble liquid manure around leafy veg.

There is still time to plant your spring bulbs.

Dead head Agapanthus.

Cut asparagus ferns to the ground when they fade.

Consider succession planting your veg to avoid a harvest glut

Apply liquid fertiliser every 2 weeks.

Prune raspberry canes – summer fruit bearer remove only canes that bore fruit this year.

Autumn fruiting varieties have all their canes cut to the ground.

Watch out for snails and slugs as thy love the cool moist atmosphere of April.

Check brassicas for caterpillars, following the plague of white butterflies.

Citrus harvest is approaching so some maintenance is required for your trees to be in optimal shape.

Feed, water in dry spells, top up mulch, remove any suckers and check for scale and leaf- miner damage.

As peach and nectarine leaves fall, spray with Bordeaux for leafcurl.
